Topic: Museum Park Super Neighborhood Parking Concerns

1. Residential Parking Permit request for 1800 block of Wichita – reportedly less than 75% residential properties on block face thus block doesn't qualify for the RPP.
 - a. Available solutions under current ordinance include Time Limits or No Parking. This is a petition process through the Traffic Engineer.
2. Parking Management understands that current ordinance isn't workable in Museum Park due to the highly mixed use environment.

Parking Management proposed a pilot program, called a Community Parking Program, for Museum Park which may be more encompassing and helpful. Pilot Program still in development, will initially be a non-codified ordinance.

Boundaries of pilot study still under consideration.

Consideration of ringed approach, meters in commercial areas with 2-4 permits available per entity.

Museum Park would like to consider Parking Benefit District.

Council review- summer 2018; implementation summer/fall 2018.

Signage will be closely evaluated to minimize sign clutter; large green signs will be removed.
